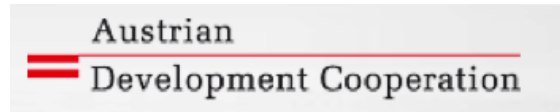

Frequently Asked Questions

Master of Medical Anthropology and International Health

In this document students or prospective candidates for the course will find answers to some of their inquiries. You are, however, requested to seek further clarifications about any matter by sending questions to the country course coordinator Dr. Grace Akello. Gulu University and the Medical University of Vienna were jointly awarded a grant to start this course. There will be a close corporation between the two universities in teaching and supervising students. Students who show exceptional capabilities will be recommended for continuation to PhD in partner Universities in Europe and overseas.

Where and when will the course be taught?

The course Master of Medical Anthropology and International will be taught at Gulu University, under the Department of Mental Health, Faculty of Medicine. Students will be awarded a Master of Medical Anthropology and International Health degree of Gulu University after fulfilling all the requirement for this course. The course will commence in September 2013. The proposed course is multidisciplinary in nature, and applications are invited from students with various academic backgrounds including biomedicine, social science, science education, arts, and the humanities.

What is the duration of this course?

In line with Uganda's academic calendar, Masters Courses take two academic years to complete. The first academic year is dedicated to theory and field exposure. In the second year

students will mostly work on independent health related research projects. Each student will be allocated two supervisors to guide them in proposal development, ethical clearance, fieldwork, data analysis and dissertation writing.

How is the course organized?

This is a full-time course, which will take two years to complete. The theory part, taught in the first academic year, is organized in modules. Re-known national and international medical anthropologists [see the list below] will teach these modules. Individuals who wish to apply only for singular modules are welcome to do so. Priority will, however, be given to two-year master students

Who are the teachers of this course?

Through this course, students will be exposed to internationally recognized medical anthropologists and specialists as reflected in the table below.

How much will be charged for tuition fees?

A complete application should include the following: a letter that indicates the applicant's interest in the programme and past education and life experiences that demonstrate an aptitude and interest in the subject matter of the programme; two letters of reference (at least one from an academic source), a current CV and academic transcripts.
